Maps will be available from the first garden you visit at a cost of £3 which covers entry to all of them. All proceeds to St. Andrews Church. Come along and be inspired or just use it as an excuse for a good walk round the village, some excellent tea and cake and a chance to be really nosy.

FEAST WEEK

Our combined stall with the Allotment Society at the Feast Week Fun Day on Saturday 11th July from 11am until 4pm has the theme 'Girton Remembers' and 'Dig for Victory'. One important reason for doing this is to raise awareness in the village as a whole about the GGS and what it does. Volunteers on the day are able to talk to visitors about what we do and show them our Programme.

The fund raising part will come from donated baskets and tubs and some herbs and plants that we will sell, ready for collection towards the end of the afternoon so that we don't lose half our display by 12.30.

The other part will be the mini competition. The June Parish News has a list of all classes so I won't reproduce them here. I will just remind you that all entries need to be brought to the stall by 12 noon, vegetables and fruit displayed on plain white paper plates (which can be provided at the stall) flowers displayed in jam jars and mini gardens in foil or seed trays. All entrants will fill in a card with the class and variety being entered on one side and their name and telephone number on the other (hidden from view).

Peter Seaber has agreed to do the judging at 12 noon and rosettes will be awarded then so that all visitors to the stall in the afternoon will be able to see the award winning entries. These will also be announced over the sound system later in the afternoon.

So, whatever your speciality is, straight beans, funny carrots or beautiful flowers get growing and bring something to the stall.

If you have already volunteered a basket or tub to be sold then many thanks, if you haven't but are willing to - then give me a ring on 01223 276819 as I have the list. If possible these should be brought to the stall between 9 - 10.30 am so we have plenty of time to display them. We hope to have some old tools on display and a very old lawn mower to help make the stall look authentic and Judith Addison is providing some bunting. Any volunteers to help on the day (phone or e-mail us) will be most welcome in appropriate 1940's dress if possible. Also can we make another request for lightweight tables for the competition? Between the two societies we will need 6 in total. We have a lot to live up to, having won 'the best dressed stall' last year.
